	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Contacting participants with event details such as timings, where to meet etc• Promoting events, for example by creating posters, using social media, issuing press releases• Supervising participants during the litter pick events• Being responsible for the safety and welfare of participants including providing PPE• Recording and reporting the types of litter collected• Arranging for the litter to be recycled or disposed of once the event has taken place• Sending follow up communications to participants
The skills you need:	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• An interest in the countryside and environmental issues• Experience in organising events• Enjoy volunteering outdoors• Have an active and hands-on attitude• Like being out and about and meeting new people• Good communication and organisational skills• Happy carrying out tasks independently and as part of a team with occasional attendance at meetings• Have access to a computer and the internet at home and be confident using them
